BACKGROUND and **UPDATE**

JOHN R WATSON RENOVATION UPDATE

- 2017-22 Several design concepts and funding strategies worked on my Brush Park, and City GSD
- 2021 Additional parcels acquired and added to the park
- 2022 City recieves ARPA funding to officially begin the renovation
- 2022 City develops construction plans based on community feedback, City crews demolish old park features.
- 2023-24 Renovation is underway with a contractor, Decima Inc.
- 2024 Community Benefits Ordinance funding anticipated from Detroit Life Building project:

Within thirty (30) days of Developer closing on its construction financing for the renovation of the Detroit Life Building at 2210 Park Avenue, Developer will make a grant of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to the City of Detroit to be used for renovations of the John R. Watson Park.

This document outlines what is already funded at the park, and what additional features are proposed to be added with the CBO funds.

APPROXIMATE COSTS FOR PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS:

ARTIFICAL TURF IN DOG PARK -	\$95,000
ADDITIONAL SEATING AREAS -	\$35,000
ADDITIONAL PLAY AND SENSORY FEATURES -	\$60,000

Remaing funds can go towards project overhead or additional ornamental plants.

*CURRENTLY IN CONTRACT. GSD WILL PLACE IN PARK DURING SUMMER MONTHS. IF TABLES ARE TOO EASILY VANDALIZED OR STOLED, GSD WILL DETERMINE IF REPLACEMENTS ARE POSSIBLE, OR TO USE A MORE SURFACE MOUNTED TABLES.



CURRENTLY IN CONTRACT: 6 SURFACE MOUNTED BENCHES

PROPOSED: 2 ADDITIONAL BENCHES

APPROXIMATELY \$10,000 TO INSTALL 2 ADDITIONAL BENCHES

ADDITIONAL PLAY AND SENSORY FEATURES - PROPOSED

ADDITIONAL PLAY AND SENSORY PIECES THESE SMALLER PIECES CAN GREATLY ENHANCE PLAY AREAS, WITHOUT DRAMATICALLY INCREASING THE OVERALL FOOTPRINT OF THE PLAYGROUND.



PLANT MATERIAL and BRICK PIERS - The largest visible change to the park will be the installation of large ornamental planting beds along both John R. and Watson. These beds will be bordered by a series of brick piers, which will serve as a visual demarcation for the park and street, and also tie the design to the brick found throughout the district.
